By providing for Professional Development Exchange days, Lago Vista ISD will allow and encourage our instructional staff to pursue professional learning when it is most appropriate for them. Furthermore, exchange days allow teachers to participate in self-selected activities that are differentiated to meet their individual needs.

EXCHANGE DAYS FOR TEACHERS, LIBRARIANS, & SPECIALISTS

Exchange days allow teachers to complete 12 hours of professional development during the year in exchange for an equal number of hours off at the end of the year. This year, the District will be closed for instructional staff on the following two (2) Professional Development Exchange Days:

Tuesday, May 26, 2020 Wednesday, May 27, 2020

- ✓ In exchange for the two days off in the spring, teachers, librarians, and specialists must complete professional development equaling 12 total credit hours during non-contractual time.
- √ 12 credit hours are satisfied by successfully completing subject-area instruction training, as required by the Texas Education Agency.
- ✓ Exchange hours may be accumulated by attending professional development summer sessions, online sessions, or after-school sessions. A variety of options are included in this document. <u>All</u> exchange hours must be completed during non-contractual or non-work time.
- ✓ Only training endorsed or approved by the District will fulfill requisite professional development exchange hours. Outside training may be considered for credit if approved by campus principal.
- ✓ Professional development exchange credit hours may be accumulated between June 1, 2019 and May 1, 2020. Instruction-related summer training satisfies exchange credit hours (i.e., AP Summer Institute, OnRamps, etc.).
- ✓ All training must be pre-approved by campus administration and documented with certificates.

Campus/District administrators, counselors, office support staff, instructional paraprofessionals, and other non-exempt time clock (hourly) employees scheduled to work on May 26 and May 27 will work as scheduled.

^{*}Each campus shall have two Campus PD Days and two Teacher Workdays.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT EXCHANGE DAYS

What are Exchange Days?

Exchange Days are a way to exchange District-required professional development time for two designated days off during the school year. Rather than requiring instructional employees to be physically present for two 6-hour days of professional development, those employees accumulate an equivalent number of hours outside of the regular workday and substitute the hours for the designated professional development days on the calendar.

What is the purpose of Exchange Days?

Exchange Days promote appropriate and effective professional learning for all instructional staff by allowing professional development activities to be selected based on personal learning needs related to specific content areas. Eligible staff members, with approval from their campus principal, select professional development activities that best contribute to their own professional growth.

Who is required to earn credit for Exchange Days?

Teachers, librarians, and instructional specialists are required to earn credit for Exchange Days.

Who is not eligible to earn credit for Exchange Days?

Administrators, counselors, office support staff, instructional paraprofessionals, and other non-exempt time clock (hourly) employees are not eligible for Exchange Days. These employees will work on May 26 and May 27 as scheduled.

How many hours of Exchange Credit do I need to earn?

Eligible employees must earn credit for two contract days, or 12 hours of professional development credit. Six hours of professional development time is equivalent to one contract day.

When are the Exchange Days?

The Exchange Days for 2019-2020 are May 26, 2020 and May 27, 2020. The District will be closed for instructional staff on those days.

When does my Professional Development Exchange Credit have to be completed?

Teachers must submit all credit requests for Professional Development Exchange Time to their campus principal through Eduphoria on or before May 1, 2020. Campus principals must submit the list of employees who have met the requirements for Exchange Days no later than May 8, 2020.

What professional development activities can be used to earn Exchange Time credit?

Eligible employees earn credit by attending professional development activities that relate directly to content-area instruction. All exchange hour professional development activities must be selected with principal approval and be documented with certificates.

Can online professional development count for Exchange Time credit?

Yes, as long as the professional development is approved by the campus principal and is completed outside of the teacher's regular contract hours. All Exchange Hours must be documented with certificates.

What happens if I do not earn appropriate exchange hour credit for these days? If appropriate credit hours for an Exchange Day are not earned for these days:

- 1. The employee's pay will be docked at the daily rate of pay in order to return the unearned compensation received for the day(s); AND
- 2. A day of leave will be docked for each unearned Exchange Day.

Appeals due to extenuating circumstances may be made by submitting a letter in writing to the superintendent.

What happens if I earn <u>more</u> than 12 professional development hours off contract?

Eligible staff may attend more than 12 hours of professional development, however, only 12 will count toward Exchange Day credit hours. Eligible staff must earn at least 12 hours to satisfy the Exchange Day requirement. All hours, including hours that count for Exchange Day credit, may count toward additional certifications or certification renewals.

If there is a fee associated with the professional development activity and the campus covers the cost of this fee, can the credit still be used for Exchange Time?

Yes, the campus can cover the cost of the professional development activity, with principal approval. Requests for campus funds to register for professional development must be requested in advance and approved by the principal prior to registering. However, eligible staff members may not receive supplemental stipends when earning Exchange Time credit.

What if I am an instructional paraprofessional?

Instructional paraprofessionals and other hourly employees who follow the regular instructional calendar are not eligible for Exchange Days. Any training completed outside of regular contract hours will be done on the clock with pay. Instructional paraprofessionals and other hourly employees who follow the regular instructional calendar will be expected to work on the Exchange Days. However, these employees do have the option to use a non-duty day to take off on an Exchange Day because the staff development requirements from TEA do not apply to them.

COURSE OPTIONS TO FULFILL EXCHANGE HOURS

Eligible employees have an infinite array of professional development options to fulfill exchange hours. What follows are selected options for content-area exchange hour credit. This is not an exhaustive list, so if you are aware of another opportunity, it may still be approved for exchange hours. All exchange hour professional development activities must be selected with principal approval. Also, please remember that in order to receive credit for exchange hours for outside trainings/workshops, certificates must be uploaded, and "exchange hour" credit must be requested in Eduphoria. Note: It is crucial that you specifically request exchange credit in this process!

IN-DISTRICT SUMMER TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES THAT SATISFY EXCHANGE HOURS

Course certificates for in-district trainings are automatically awarded through Eduphoria and do not need to be requested. Please register for the trainings below in Eduphoria. Please contact the presenter if you have questions. All non-District exchange opportunities must be approved through your campus principal or supervisor using a PD Request form. [See Appendix]
